We had a strong showing for our Environmental Justice Committee last week. Now it's time to turn the focus to housing!

Charleston County released the long-awaited Housing Our Future plan in January and now they are hosting public comment sessions around Charleston County to get the public's input on the plan. The Housing Committee is asking **YOU** to turn out to the public comment session on Tuesday, February 28 at 5:15pm at the Johns Island Library. We will hold a short rally and press conference before the public comment session starts.

The number one recommendation in the Housing Our Future plan is an Affordable Housing Trust Fund, which is exactly what CAJM has been pushing for for years. So let's turn out **STRONG** to the public comment session and let Charleston County know that we aren't going anywhere until we win an Affordable Housing Trust Fund for our community!




