

#### What is Juneteenth?



June 20, 2022 was the first time in American history that Juneteenth was observed as a federal holiday! But there is still a lot of confusion as to what Juneteenth is, and why it should be celebrated. Juneteenth is the holiday that celebrates the commemoration of emancipation for enslaved persons in America. Although the Emancipation Proclamation was signed by President Abraham Lincoln on January 1, 1863, news didn't reach Galveston, Texas until June 19th, 1865 when Major

General George Granger and the Union troops he led landed there. One of General Granger's first acts was to read General Order #3 which begins, "The people of Texas are informed that in accordance with a Proclamation from the Executive of the United States, all slaves are free." This brought about widespread celebration and people seeking new lives in surrounding states.

Newly freed people began to coin the term Juneteenth to commemorate the momentous June day! The celebrations have been taking place in states such as Texas, Arkansas, Oklahoma, and Louisiana since that day. Celebrations typically include education and communal entertainment. Juneteenth is the oldest commemoration of the ending of slavery in the United States. It becoming a federal holiday is an important step forward in acknowledging the dark and ugly history of America. Black history is America's history and should be celebrated as such!




