Your Voice Matters!

Last Tuesday, members of the Housing Committee gathered together at the Lonnie Hamilton Public Services Building in North Charleston for the County Council meeting. Several brave members shared powerful statements during the public comment period. They continued to urge council members to establish an affordable housing trust fund with a continuous funding source. This campaign is in full swing so be on the lookout for upcoming research visit dates with public officials and industry experts. Until then, here is one of the statements given at council last week, and the recording of the rest of the statements. Good afternoon Council,

My name is Betty Niermann and I'm a member of the St. John's Catholic Church in North Charleston.

I'm sure you are aware the City of Beaufort, Beaufort County, Jasper County, Hilton Head Island, Port Royal, Bluffton, Hardeeville and Yemassee have all decided to form a regional affordable housing trust fund. The main goal of their trust fund is to create additional workforce jobs and affordable housing units. They have joined the approximately 800 other trust funds

throughout the country. This is what we as the Charleston Area Justice Ministry have been saying since 2017. The creation of an affordable housing trust fund is a necessary part of a housing plan for a community in a housing crisis such as ours. From the presentations given by your consultants, we understand there will be many tools suggested to begin combating this crisis. All of these tools will need a continuous funding source outside of the \$20 million you have already set aside. An affordable housing trust fund is one of the tools that can produce its own return on investment. We implore you to heed their advice and not only establish an affordable housing trust fund, but to ensure that it protects the most vulnerable. Ensure that those who make 50% and below of the area median income will have a place to live in Charleston. Not just live, not just survive, but be able to thrive!


