That's a very sanitized version of events. Truth is for many who call this land home, this holiday's remembrance is not guite so peaceful. We know that an unknown number of Indigenous people lost their lives and their native land over the government's desire for land expansion. Even the "Great Emancipator" Abraham Lincoln did not protect Indigenous people. One week before he signed the Emancipation Proclamation to free enslaved Africans, he approved the hanging of 38 Dakota Sioux Warriors for having the audacity of defending their territory. It is estimated that by treaty and executive order over 1.5 billion acres of tribal land was taken between 1776 and 1887 according to Flowing Data.com (Mapped history of how Native American land was taken I Flowing Data).

So, this week as we are being thankful for our many blessings, take some time to acknowledge the Indigenous people of this land. Let us be mindful that Thanksgiving isn't a happy holiday for everyone in this country. Let us honor the people who first inhabited this land by speaking their names. In the Charleston area, we are in the land of the Yamasee, Kusso, Santee, Waccamaw, Chicora, and more. A resource that you can begin with is the Laurier Student's Public Interest Research Group.
