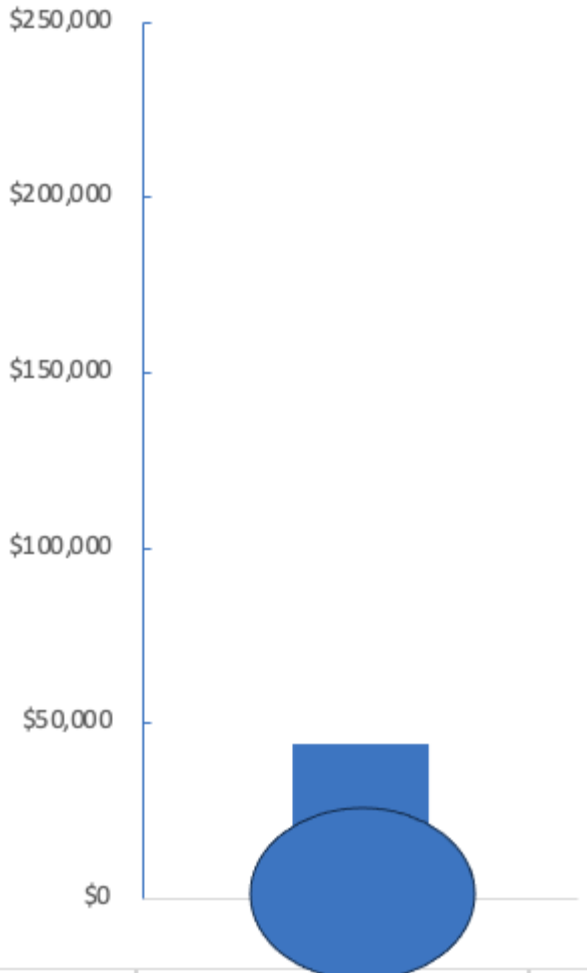

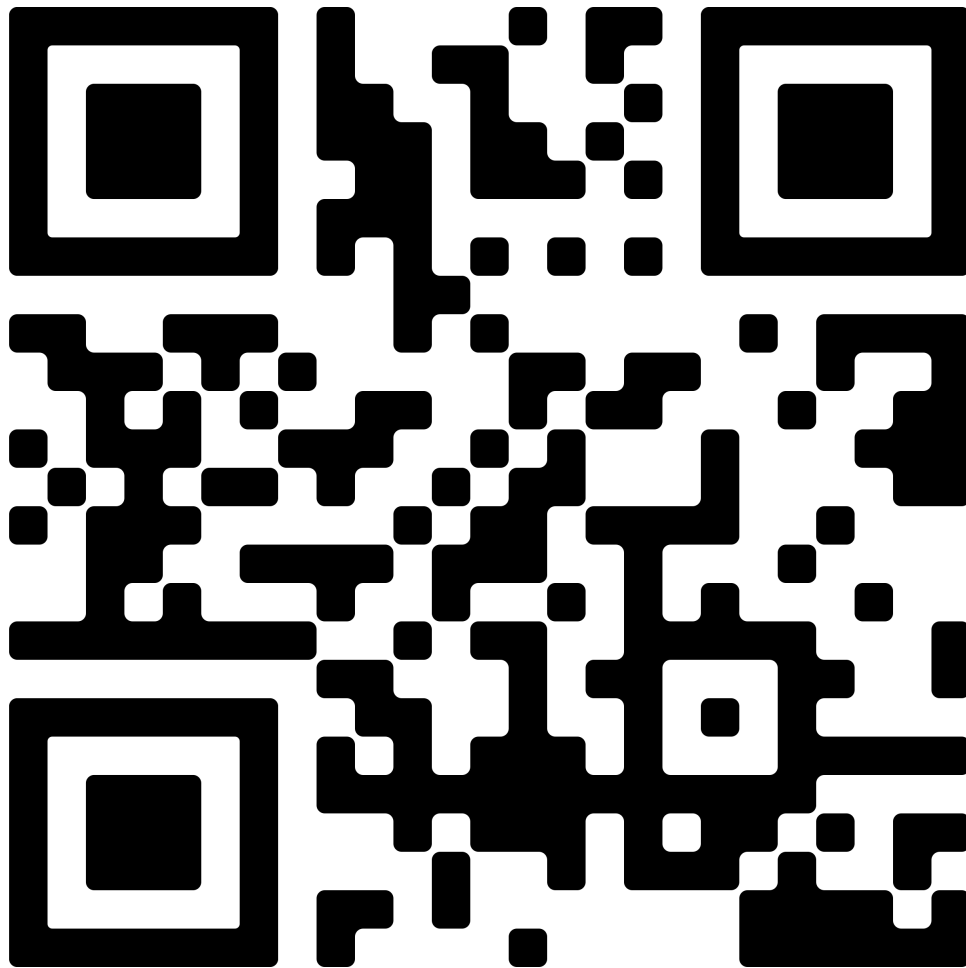
CAJM Annual Celebration
