Why do you invest?

In last week's Manna, we featured LuAnn Rosenzweig and Jamilah Frazier who shared what inspires them to

invest in CAJM. Like LuAnn and Jamilah, each of us has a story about why we give our money to the Justice Ministry.

We'll be sharing those stories this Spring and early Summer as we hear from CAJM Network Members during this year's congregational drive and investment cycle.

One of those persons is Deacon Marionette Bennett with Calvary Episcopal. Deacon Bennett joined CAJM in 2021 upon learning how the justice ministry seeks to make "justice equal across the board." She was impressed by CAJM's work in so many issues, but she's particularly passionate about environmental justice at Gadsden Creek.

"Why take property away that's belonged to people for centuries?" she asked.

Deacon Bennett said people should invest in CAJM because the organization has its hands in so many problems where justice needs to be realized. In education, for example, this involves making sure that all schools treat all children fairly, she said. In policing, its about making sure that Black people are not pulled over more frequently and treated unfairly in comparison to White people, she said.

"CAJM is for the good of all people," she said.

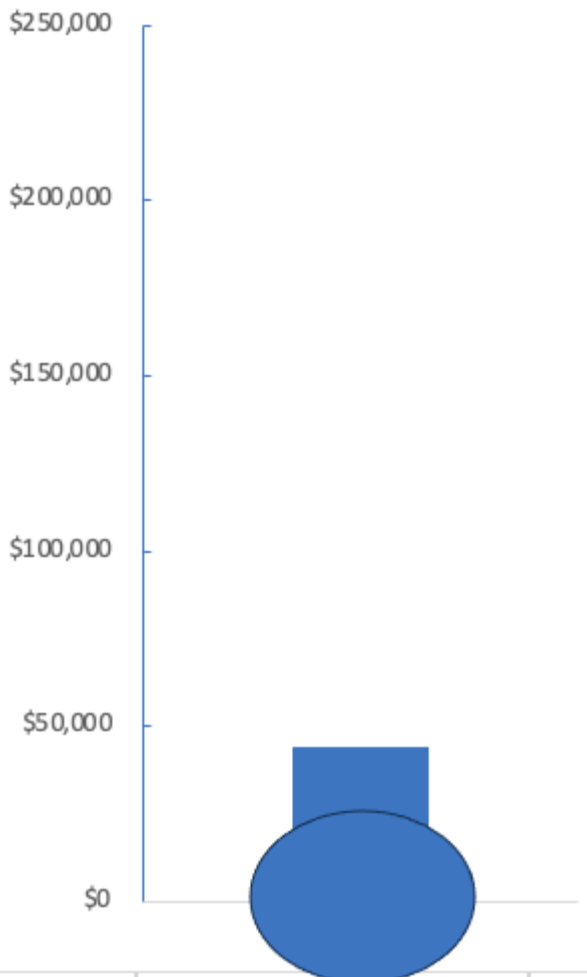
