This Black History Month, we celebrate the deep roots of our organizing work in the freedom struggles that came before us. From the Charleston hospital workers' strike of 1969 to the lunch counter sit-ins, Black communities in the Lowcountry have always known that justice requires organization, relationship, and collective power.

That legacy has been carried on through CAJM leaders like the late Rev. Joe Darby, Rev. Nelson B. Rivers, III, Ms. Minerva King, and Dr. Millicent Brown, folks who've spent decades showing us what faithful organizing looks like. Now we see that same fire in leaders like Rev. Byron Benton, Rev. Cecilia Armstrong, Rev. Adam Shoemaker, and many more, and in young organizers like Zuriel Nyamutsaka, who spoke at our most recent Nehemiah Action. Many others are stepping up to lead. We're watching our community build leaders who are running for office and changing the landscape of our world through the very skills we specialize in developing.

At CAJM, we carry forward what generations have taught us through the simple but powerful practice of one-on-ones. Real conversations where we listen to each other's stories, understand what keeps us up at night, and discover our shared stake in building something better.

When you develop the skills to have a good one-on-one, to research power, and to hold leaders accountable at a public action, you're not just learning organizing tactics, you're gaining a framework for building justice wherever you go. Whether you're in your congregation, your neighborhood association, your workplace, running for office, or serving your family, these skills help you bring people together and make real change. That's the gift of community organizing: it doesn't just win campaigns, it **transforms us into the kind of leaders our communities need**. From Rev. Darby's legacy to our young people stepping into their power today, we're all part of an unbroken chain, building a more just world for everyone.

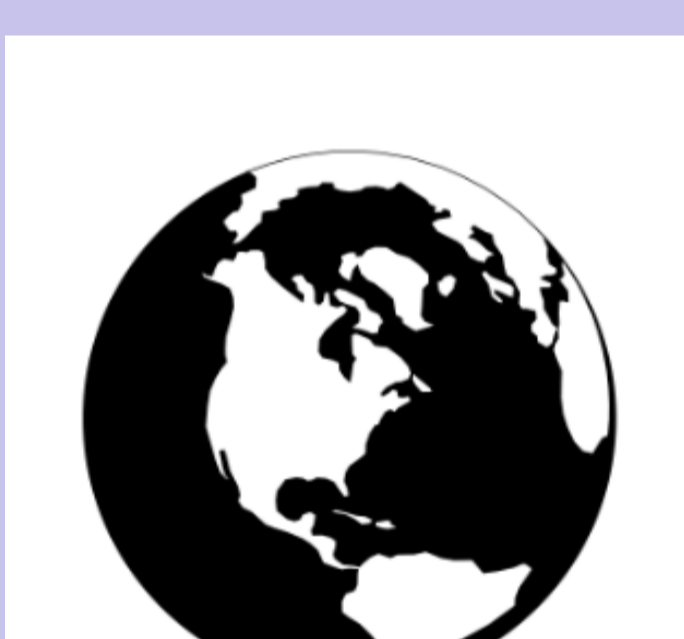

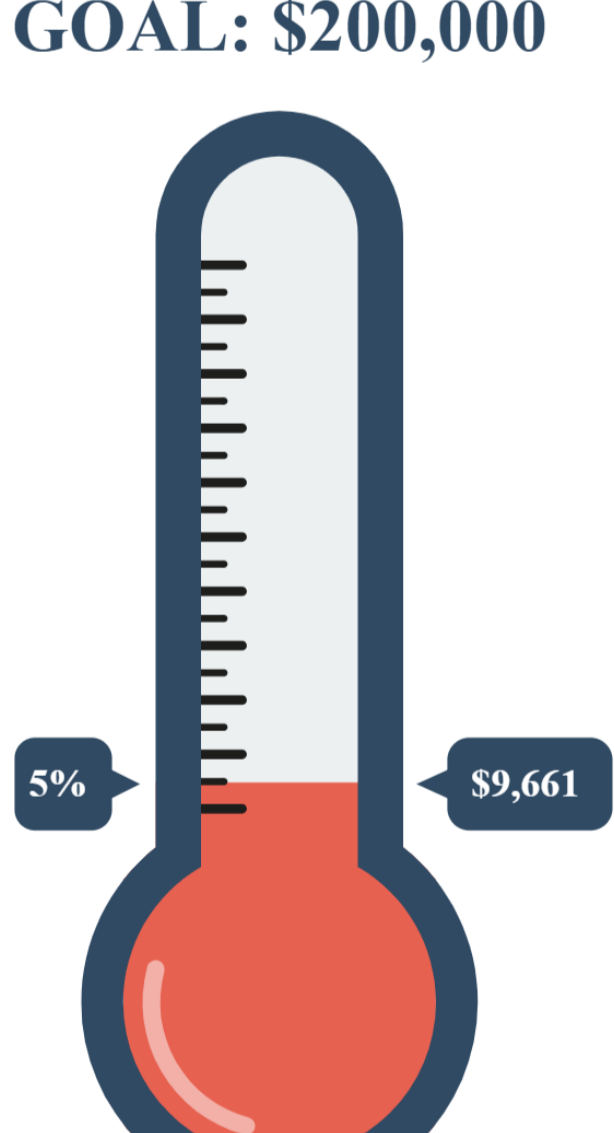

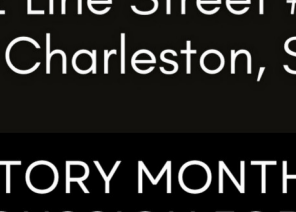
